



Math for America–Boston 2020 Teachers’ Grant

The MfA Boston Teachers’ Grant for academic year 2020-2021 is a \$1,000 - \$5,000 grant offered to successful applicants beginning in the fall of 2020. This grant program is for projects designed to improve the learning of mathematics by students in high-needs schools in the greater Boston area. The entire award must go to support the activities.

Deadline: May 30, 2020.

Criteria: The applicant must be a mathematics teacher, math coach, or group of teachers in grades 9-12 in a high-needs public school district in the greater Boston area, or else a graduate student in mathematics or mathematics education working with a high-needs public school population, grades 9-12. The focus of this grant is on mathematics (as opposed to a focus on classroom management, purchasing whiteboards, etc.) and projects should have a direct impact on students and schools.

Completed applications will consist of the following:

1. Your resume(s).
2. Your project proposal (two pages, maximum).
3. A timeline and budget outline that includes a breakdown for the intended use of the grant.
4. A letter from your principal that supports this project.
5. A letter as recommendation from a peer or colleague.

Review Procedures: Decisions will be made based on the quality of the application, potential impact of the project, and quality of supporting materials.

Requirements:

1. Projects must be completed within one academic year (no later than June 30).
2. Grant recipients will be expected to submit a mid-year progress report at the end of the first semester, and a final report at the end of the project.
